









<p>Brief Report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ On January 1st around 7:30 am , Tamil Nadu NSS Volunteer team of around 14 members and 2 volunteers from Puducherry along with our contingent leader Dr.M.P Ganesan reached the campsite at International youth hostel, NYAYA MARG, Chanakyapuri, New Delhi. There was an enthusiastic environment around us because the whole hostel was filled by around 200 NSS volunteers from all over India. At first, we faced some language barriers but as days passed by we developed a unity and proved the concept of <i>unity in diversity</i> and also showed that friendship needs no language. ➤ On January 2nd RD Camp Schedule was given. Our Camp Director was Dr.C. Samuel Chelliah - NSS Regional Director Chennai. He was a very active and lively person. He motivated us. From 4th January to 8th January, we did our parade practice near the National Police Memorial. ➤ On 4th January we had an inauguration function, Hon. Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports Rajya Vardhan Singh Rathore and Mrs. Upma Chowdhury, IAS Secretary of youth affairs were our chief guests and they inaugurated the Camp. Various cultural events from different states and union territories were performed ➤ From 9th January we were taken to Dyal Singh College, Delhi university for parade practice. Our instructors are from the army wing. On 10th January, the instructors started to select the volunteers for the parade from 200 they selected only 160. From 10th January to 14th January there were 5 sets to practice in Rajpath. ➤ Every day, the contingent leaders and the camp director will choose one male and female volunteer from a different state for the MOST VALUABLE STUDENT of the day award on the basis of their performance, behaviour and discipline. Everyday 2 from each state will get it. On 14th January it was my day to receive the MVS AWARD of the day along with Kerala volunteers. It was a proud and delightful moment for me. ➤ On 15th January, our Tamil Nadu team celebrated PONGAL at Delhi. The cultural event was conducted by Tamil Nadu students. We rocked the stage. ➤ From 17th January we were taken to Rajpath for parade practice at 4: 30 am. We will march on the Rajpath road till India Gate which is around 4 km. Every pain of our marching vanished when we saw our majestic INDIA GATE. ➤ On the 20th parade uniforms were given, on the 23rd we had a full-dress rehearsal at Rajpath, we marched along with all other army wings, NCC cadets etc. We got good appreciation from the officers who were in incharge of Republic Day. On 24th around 65 NSS volunteers got a golden opportunity to meet Hon.Prime Minister, Mr. Narendhra Modi He addressed us with a blessing for our parade and gave a 	

motivational speech about youths and finally we all took a group photo with him and our Defence Minister Mrs. Nirmala Seetharaman.

- On 26th January we woke up at 3:00 am and got ready and had our breakfast at 4:00am and around 4 :30 am we reached Rajpath. There was heavy security during the day. We were thoroughly checked before entering the Rajpath road. The most awaited moment came nearby, everyone was very excited. NSS is the only community based civil service marching contingent. We saluted the PM, PRESIDENT and the CHIEF GUEST for 70th REPUBLIC DAY, Hon. President of South Africa Mr. Cyril Ramaphosa.
- Finally, the moment came, around 10:20 am we started to march. We were proudly marching towards the India Gate. Our patriotism was seen in our parade. Our dream finally came true. The most valuable National Camp of NSS was the Republic day parade camp and I finally achieved it with great success. I was standing in 7th ROW 2nd COLUMN next to the right marker. I felt very proud that I am also the one representing 40 lakhs NSS volunteers all over the country and the first NSS VOLUNTEER representing DR.MGR.JANAKI COLLEGE, CHENNAI.
- On 26th Jan, the 70th REPUBLIC DAY was very special to us. We took many memorable photos after the parade. We reached the hostel around 3:00pm for lunch. Evening we took a rest and the day was finished peacefully with lots of happiness because we achieved our dream, our success and a gain for our pain.
- On 27th Jan, we were taken to meet Hon. President of India, Mr. Ramnath Govind took a group photo with him and then we had snacks while visiting the Mughal garden and admired its beautiness. It was a gifted moment.
- On 28th Jan, around 8: 30 am we were taken to meet Hon.Vice president Mr. Venkaiah Naidu and he addressed us with a speech, he highlighted that NSS should become mandatory in every school and college. After that we had tea and snacks then we returned to the hostel.
- On the 29th we were taken on a trip to AGRA, the journey started at 5: 00 am itself by bus. We reached Agra around 10:30 am and we had a chance to see one of the seven wonders of the world, the symbol of love, THE *TAJ MAHAL*. For lunch we went to Dr. Ambedkar university, Agra around 3 pm and there held a meeting to congratulate the RD CAMP participants. Then we reached the hostel by 11pm. It was a jolly trip.
- On 30th Jan morning we were taken to LOTUS TEMPLE and local shops for purchasing and we had our valedictory function in the evening and also a certificate distributed. - They also conducted various competitions for the kinder garden, primary students and also for women.
