

# STAKEHOLDERS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT - STUDENTS

#### STUDENTS FEEDBACK SUMMARY:

In the academic year 2019-2020, Dr. MGR Janaki College conducted a feedback survey with 997 responses from students. The majority of students reported positive experiences regarding the completion of syllabus on time, thorough class preparation by teachers, and an excellent approach to teaching. A significant number of students also expressed satisfaction with the college's efforts in fostering personal and academic growth, encouraging participation in extracurricular activities, and instilling soft skills, life skills, and employability skills.

The feedback also highlighted positive sentiments toward the internal testing system, availability of recommended reference books in the library, and the overall ambience of the college. However, some areas received a slightly lower percentage of strong agreement, such as the availability of reference books and satisfaction with classroom and laboratory infrastructure.

#### **Syllabus Completion:**

- 89% of students stated that the syllabus is always completed on time.
- 7% mentioned that the syllabus is completed on time most of the time.

#### **Teaching Quality:**

- 82% strongly agreed that teachers prepare for classes thoroughly.
- 12% agreed with this statement.
- 89% described their teachers' approach to teaching as excellent, while 8% described it as very good.

- 86% felt that their performance in internal tests was discussed with them every time.

#### **Learning and Personal Growth:**

- 81% strongly agreed that the college offers numerous chances for both learning and personal growth.
- 10% agreed with this statement.





# STAKEHOLDERS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT - FACULTY

#### **FACULTY FEEDBACK SUMMARY:**

A feedback from the teaching faculty of the college was taken to have suggestions regarding the overall performance of the institution has been analysed. In the year 2019 to 2020, 125 faculty members gave their feedback. Most of the faculty members responded positively about the overall performance of the institution. The following are the observations made from the feedback given.

- The management ensures the wellness of its employees and enable them to optimize their potential. Around 70% of the faculty members are highly satisfied with the welfare measures taken by the management for the growth and development of the faculty and 28% agreed that the management showed good interest in the welfare of the faculty.
- Around 42% of the faculty members, agreed with the suitability of curriculum in terms of course outcome and program outcomes, whereas 54% percent agreed that curriculum is intellectually stimulating.
- Around 98% of the faculty members, had a good opinion that the syllabi was updated to recent scenario and is a balanced learner centred curriculum empowering learners.
- 62% of the teachers are highly satisfied with the research facility available in the college to teach, pursue research and update their research as well as pedagogical skills and 33% claim that the research facilities are sufficient in the campus.

- Around 62% of the faculty members claim that they have ample freedom to adopt new techniques/strategies of teaching to measure the learning outcomes and 32% admitted that they have the freedom to adopt new techniques of teaching and there is a conducive teaching environment in the college.
- Faculty has been provided with ample opportunities to explore new teaching methods employing ICT tools. 72% of the faculty are contented with the ICT based teaching aids facilitated in the campus and 24% are satisfied with the ICT facilities available in the campus.
- The faculty members reported that classrooms, and playgrounds are cleaned and maintained properly.
- Around 72% of the faculty members are contented with the laboratory facilities provided by the college and 25 % are satisfied with the facilities as provided by the college to enrich the learner's experience.
- The faculty agrees with and appreciates the number of opportunities available for them in the College to grow. Around 81% of the faculty members claim that the FDP Sessions organized in the college enhances the academic and intellectual knowledge and also encourages the faculty members to pursue research and also to participate in seminars / conferences / workshops. A limited number of staff members expressed a desire for additional Faculty Development Programs (FDPs) or training sessions to facilitate the integration of ICT tools in the teaching and learning processes.

# STAKEHOLDERS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT - PARENTS

#### PARENTS FEEDBACK SUMMARY:

- The data presented reflects a positive overall thought among parents regarding various aspects of their children's college experience. The satisfaction levels with college facilities are notably high, with an 83% majority expressing contentment. Only 12% report being less satisfied and a small 5% hold no specific opinion.
- In terms of communication and information dissemination, a significant 84% of parents are well-informed about academic schedules. However, there is a noteworthy 11% who feel less aware, indicating a potential area for improvement in ensuring all parents are adequately informed. Additionally, 5% of parents choose not to provide an opinion, suggesting a segment that may be indifferent or less engaged in this aspect.
- The Parent-Teacher Meetings appear to be an effective means of communication, as an overwhelming 91% of parents fully agree that they are well-informed about their ward's academic progress through these sessions. This high level of agreement suggests that these meetings play a crucial role in fostering communication between parents and educators.
- Moving on to placement programs, a substantial 90% of parents are aware of such initiatives. However, there is a noteworthy 2% who feel less informed. Ensuring that information about placement opportunities reaches all parents could contribute to a more inclusive and transparent communication process.
- Attendance tracking is another area where the majority of parents (89%) are actively involved, keeping tabs on their children's attendance. Nevertheless, there is an 11% minority who do not actively track this aspect, indicating a potential need for increased engagement or awareness in this area.
- A positive note is struck in the realm of extracurricular activities, with 83% of parents
  expressing appreciation for the college's involvement in promoting such initiatives. This
  suggests that the college is perceived as actively contributing to the holistic development
  of students.
