

STUDENTS FEEDBACK SUMMARY

In the academic year 2022-23, Dr. MGR Janaki College conducted a feedback survey among its students, receiving 945 responses. The feedback covered various aspects such as syllabus completion, teaching quality, internal test discussions, and opportunities for learning and personal growth, extracurricular activities, soft skills development, infrastructure, library facilities, and the overall ambience of the college.

Syllabus Completion:

- 92% of students reported that the syllabus is always completed on time.
- 7% mentioned that the syllabus is completed on time most of the time.

Teaching Quality:

- 90% strongly agreed that teachers prepare for classes thoroughly.
- 8% agreed with this statement.
- 93% described their teachers' approach to teaching as excellent.
- 5% described it as very good.

Internal Test Discussions:

- 92% felt that their performance in internal tests was discussed with them every time.

Opportunities for Learning and Personal Growth:

- 92% strongly agreed that the college offers numerous chances for both learning and personal growth.
 - 4% agreed with this statement.

Extracurricular Activities:

- 90% strongly agreed that the college encourages participation in extracurricular activities.



- 89% strongly agreed that college teachers actively endeavour to instil soft skills, life skills, and employability skills among students.



9. Overall Ambience:


- Address any identified areas for improvement in the overall ambience of the college.

STAKEHOLDERS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT - FACULTY

FACULTY FEEDBACK SUMMARY:

The feedback from the faculty members on the overall performance of the institution has been analysed. Most of the faculty members responded positively about the overall performance of the institution. During analysis, it has been observed that:

- Teachers reflected on the initiatives taken by the college for their growth and development.
- Majority of the teachers expressed the involvement of management in the academic enrichment of the faculty. Around 82% of the faculty members are highly satisfied with the involvement of the management in the welfare of the faculty and around 16% agreed with the statement. Overall, it shows a satisfactory picture of the welfare facilities provided to the faculty by the management.
- It is important that the quality of curriculum is monitored to serve the interests of the Students. 90 % of the faculty members expressed their satisfaction with the structured course outcome and program outcome of the syllabus. The course outcome and program outcome of the syllabi are well- defined and are student-centred. Course and Program outcomes emphasizes on the integration of knowledge.
- Around 98% of the faculty stated that the designed curriculum is holistic in nature dictating information, skills, attitudes, and values to be learned by a student as per the changing needs of the society.
- The college provides a conducive environment for teachers to achieve professional growth. 91% of the faculty agree that the College provides an environment amicable for teaching and research. Around 7 % rated the teaching and research facilities as provided by the college as very good and 2% rated as good.

- The college has effectively addressed the concerns pertaining to teaching and learning aids/methods related to future learning and global competence - 93 % responded as excellent, 5 % as very good, and 2 % as good.
- Faculty has been provided with ample opportunities to explore new teaching methods employing ICT tools. Overwhelmingly, 93% of the faculty reported being extremely satisfied with the opportunities provided to learn and use ICT tools for smooth conduct of online classes and assessment.
- The support services in campus have a big role to play in smooth functioning of the college. 93% of the faculty reported high satisfactory level of hygiene and cleanliness maintained in the campus, 5% as very good, and 2% as good. This data confirms that the efforts of the institution in providing safe, secured and comforting environment to its staff is valued and highly appreciated.
- Majority of the faculty (90%) affirms that the college provides the laboratory requirements on time for enriching the learning process. 8% of the respondents agreed to the statement and a minority of 2% provided a neutral response.
- Faculty development lies at the heart of any higher education institution to create and emphasise learner-centred teaching. The IQAC of our college regularly organizes FDP Sessions to translate field experiences into academic teaching. Majority of the faculty strongly agreed that the FDP sessions and the initiatives taken for faculty development are aimed at inculcating the highest ethical values and professionalism among the faculty.



STAKEHOLDERS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS AND ACTION TAKEN REPORT - PARENTS

PARENTS FEEDBACK SUMMARY

- The majority of respondents find the facilities in the college satisfactory, with 92% expressing a positive opinion, 7% agreeing with the opinion and 1% having no specific opinion.
- Regarding internal assessments and model examination schedules, 90% of participants report being very happy, 9% less happy and 1% stated neutral opinion.
- The majority of parents, comprising 88%, strongly agree that they are well-informed about their ward's academic progress through the Parent-Teacher Meetings conducted in the college. An additional 10% of parents agree with this statement, while only 2% remain neutral. This positive response underscores the effectiveness of the Parent-Teacher Meetings as a valuable avenue for communication between educators and parents, fostering a collaborative environment for the academic development of the students.
- The response report indicates a high level of awareness among respondents regarding the
 placement and training opportunities provided by the college, with 90% strongly agreeing, 6%
 expressing a lesser degree of agreement, and 4% choosing not to provide an opinion. This
 suggests a positive overall perception of the college's efforts in facilitating placement and
 training initiatives.
- 91% of parents indicated that our college actively tracks and monitors student attendance. 9% of parents reported that the college can improve the system for tracking student attendance and reporting parents.
- The parents were highly appreciative of the fact that our college encourages students to participate in extracurricular activities as revealed by the responses 93% rated as strongly agree, 6% as agree and 1% as neutral.





ALUMNI FEEDBACK SUMMARY

Alumni feedback from Dr. MGR Janaki College reflects overwhelmingly positive sentiments. Out of the 1200 responses collected, a consistent trend emerged with high percentages indicating satisfaction across various aspects of the educational experience.
